We ran a highly successful Sunflower Competition which was evidenced by seeing sunflowers all around the village, outside of businesses, private homes and in the LIB flowerbeds. Grayshott Potteries generously provided decorated mugs for the winners. A big thanks to Miranda Rowe for organising the competition.

Several new volunteers have come forward, including our youngest regular, Oscar.

Workdays have been well attended and on our Bulb Planting weekend we had 34 helpers taking part.

During the Bulb Planting Weekend we planted 7,200 bulbs. Alongside different varieties of daffodils, including a double variety, we planted Tulips Merlot, Lalibela, Golden Parade, White Dream and Cherry Red. We also planted nearly 2,000 pansies!

Joan Holdsworth has been single-handedly designing, ordering and co-ordinating the planting of the village beds for several years and she's decided to hand over to someone else after completing the Autumn designs 2024.
